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### - INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS -

The following information covers details concerning the proposed lump sum sale of an estimated 843,629 board feet of sawlogs and 2,287 tons of pulpwood to be cut from 286 acres of State Game Lands No. 74, Millcreek Township, Clarion County.

See attached sheets for additional volume information. The volume and percentages are not guaranteed and each prospective bidder is urged to examine the sale area and bid on the basis of his own estimate.

### - SHOW DATE -

Timber will be shown to prospective bidders on June 25, 2024. Viewers will be met at the SGL gate on the south side of Spring Drive (T-569) at the SGL road to access Blocks 1 and 2 as shown on the sale and location maps at 10:00 a.m. and conducted to the sale area.

### - BIDS -

BIDS SHOULD BE MAILED AT LEAST FOUR (4) WORKING DAYS PRIOR TO BID OPENING TO PERMIT U.S. POSTAL SERVICE DELIVERY. USE SPECIAL MAIL SERVICE IF MAILED LATER THAN FOUR DAYS PRIOR TO BID OPENING. Bid deposits will be returned to the unsuccessful bidder when the contract has been executed and a satisfactory performance deposit has been furnished.

In lieu of bid deposit, bidders may submit an open bid bond to cover the deposit requirement. Any bid bond must be filed for an annual period and both the amount of bond and the surety shall receive prior approval of the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

The Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to award the contract as deemed to its best interests.

### - PERFORMANCE DEPOSIT -

A performance bond in the amount of \$25,000.00 will be required in the form of a Certified Check or a Postal Money Order drawn to the order of the Pennsylvania Game Commission. Negotiable securities, including assignment of a bank savings account may be furnished in lieu of above. A bond with corporate surety approved by the Attorney General, or a bank Irrevocable Letter of Credit, may be posted provided the bond has an expiration date a minimum of 1 year beyond the expiration date of the timber contract.

## - EXPIRATION OF CONTRACT -

Contract will expire June 30, 2026.

## - PAYMENTS

The sale is divided into 7 cutting blocks. Payment may be made by:

1. Total payment when agreement is signed.

2. Payment by individual block or blocks.

1 - 20% - 39 acres

Payment for Block 1 is due at contract execution. Final payment is due No Later Than 120 days before the expiration of the Agreement.

## - ANTI DISCRIMINATION -

The contractor awarded the Timber Sale Agreement agrees he will not discriminate against any employee or other persons on account of race, sex, creed, age, ancestry or national origin.

## - SAFETY and ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION -

The Buyer, his employees and sub-contractors are expected to perform all logging operations in a safe manner as required by applicable laws and regulations. The Commission expects the Buyer to ensure that logging crewmembers dress in protective attire, and perform their duties with equipment in accordance with standards established by the logging industry and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

The PGC recommends that logging crews working on State Game Lands be trained in safe logging techniques and sound environmental logging practices though a formal training program such as the one provided by the Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative (PA SFI) or another similar program.

Contractor must comply with the erosion and sediment control plan for disturbed areas that is included as a part of the timber contract.

## SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR THE <u>TOXIC FOG SALE</u> S.G.L. # 74 T.S. # 074-2023-01

## 1) ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

- a) This timber sale consists of 7 blocks and has an estimated 843,629 board feet of sawtimber and 2,287 tons of pulpwood on 286 total treated acres.
- b) The Toxic Fog Timber Sale on State Game Land 74 covers 286 acres in Millcreek Township, Clarion County. Blocks 1 & 2 can be accessed by Spring Drive (T-569) while blocks 4-7 can be accessed by Old State S (T-562).
- c) All contractors, subcontractors and consultants of the Buyer must be pre-approved by the Commission. The Commission reserves the right to reject any subcontractor at its sole discretion. If Contractor enters into any subcontract(s) not previously approved by the Commission, the Commission shall have the right to require the Contractor to terminate such contracts.
- d) All cutting, cleanup and site retirement must be completed for blocks 1 & 2 prior to July 1, 2025.
- e) The contractor must submit a PA One Call prior to all logging activities. A buried gas pipeline and an above ground pipeline run through block 1. The contractor may need to cross these pipelines with temporary skidding bridges. Prior to operations in this block, the operator must contact and have an on-site meeting with all relevant OGM operators identified during the PA One Call process.
- f) Blocks 1, 2, 3, and 6 contain advanced regeneration and caution should be taken to minimize damage. No fully mechanized equipment will be allowed in any of the 7 blocks. Prohibited equipment includes grapple skidders, feller bunchers, processors, etc. The Regional Forester or his designee have the right to inspect and reject any equipment they deem inappropriate.
- g) Payment for Block 1 is due at contract execution. Final payment is due no later than 120 days before the expiration of the agreement.

## 2) BOUNDARIES, BLOCKS, AND CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

- a) Timber sale blocks are bounded by both roads and two blue stripes. Gameland boundaries are designated with white blazes.
- b) Most of block 1 and the entire block 3 are enclosed in an 8-foot woven wire fence. The contractor is responsible for repairing any damage that may occur to these fences during logging operations.
- c) Trees to be cut in all blocks are marked with YELLOW paint.
- d) Trees marked with a YELLOW "G" are to be girdled. Two parallel, horizontal grooves deep enough to go through the cambium layer must be cut around the circumference of the tree.
- e) Snags are to be left standing unless they present a safety hazard. Any reserved trees that are felled for safety reasons must be left at the stump.
- f) Game Land boundary, roads, herbaceous openings, and spring runs are to be kept free of tops.

- g) Within a block, cutting of polewood and sawtimber shall proceed in a complete and orderly manner. All cutting in one block must be completed to the satisfaction of the Regional Forester or his designee before commencing operations in a subsequent block.
- h) All stumps must be cut lower than 12" ground height.
- i) Cull portions of the tree are to be left at the stump. All logs and pulpwood are to be marked to length in the woods to eliminate short ends at the landings.
- j) No whole tree harvesting, or on-site chipping is permitted.
- k) All top wood 3-inch diameter and smaller is reserved and shall not be removed from the site.
- I) Extra caution should be taken to avoid felling damage or skidding damage to reserved trees.
- m) Except for the contractor, no persons shall be permitted to cut or remove firewood.
- n) All tops must be pulled back 15 feet from all SGL boundaries, roads, road ditches/ diversions, culvert pipes, powerlines and spring runs.

## 3) US/STATE/LOCAL ROADS

a) Trucking for blocks 1 & 2 will use Spring Drive (T-569) and trucking for blocks 4-7 will use Old State S (T-562). The use of these roads must be coordinated with Millcreek Township. For more information contact:

b) SR 1001 (Fisher-Strattanville Rd) has posted weight limits and must be bonded. For more information contact the PennDot District 10 Office (Permits) at 724-357-2832.

## 4) ROADS TO MAINTAIN

Total distance of State Game Land access roads to maintain is 32,184 feet or 6.1 miles.

## a) General Road Specs

- 1. The contractor will be required to maintain the gameland roads in "as good or better condition" throughout sale operations. The gameland haul roads to be used for this timber sale are open to public traffic for hunting access. These roads may be open from October to January and must always remain open and passable.
- The contractor must submit a PA One Call prior to all logging activities. Buried gas pipelines
  cross the game land road that accesses blocks 1 & 2. Prior to operations in this block, the
  operator must contact and have an on-site meeting with all relevant OGM operators identified
  during the PA One Call process.
- All treetops and logging debris must be removed from the ditches and road banks along all
  roads throughout the timber sale area to allow for proper road drainage and future road
  maintenance.

- 4. Upon conclusion of use and as directed by the Regional Forester or his designee, the haul road will be graded. All roads must be graded with a motor grader. Total distance to grade and maintain is 32,184 feet or 6.1 miles smooth and rut-free, with 12-foot running surface or the roadway original width, whichever is wider, and with positive drainage including ditches, broad based dips, and turnouts. Roads must be crowned or sloped, as directed by the Regional Forester or designee, to drain all water into ditches and culverts. Any and all piles of surface sidecast should be graded level by feathering it back into the road berms and/ or road surface during final grading. Road berms should be graded to mow-able contour. The roads must then be rolled with a vibratory road roller (minimum 10 tons) after grading is complete.
  See Attachment A for the required road conditions after grading.
- 5. There are existing culverts along the hauling route. These culverts are to be maintained in good working condition throughout hauling operations. The contractor is responsible for damage to culverts/ headwalls resulting from timber operation. The contractor will immediately repair and/ or replace damaged culverts with new black corrugated double-walled smoothbore plastic culvert pipes of equivalent diameter and length as the damaged culvert, will remove damaged culverts from the Game Lands, and will re-construct headwalls as directed by the Regional Forester or his designee.
- 6. Any freshly disturbed soil from the road work must be immediately seeded with oats or wheat (as determined by the Regional Forester or his designee at a rate of 30lbs./ acre while the soil is freshly disturbed.
- 7. Gates are to be kept closed and always locked except when the contractor is present on the site.

## b) Road Improvements

 The Contractor will be required to apply 66 tons of stone to a culvert crossing between blocks 1 & 2. Some stone coverage on this culvert was lost during a recent rain event and must be replaced. A bulldozer or excavator can be used to spread and grade this stone. Stone will need to be purchased and is not available on site.

## 5) LANDINGS

- a) Existing landings are shown on the sale map. The operator may also utilize roadside landings with the approval of the Regional Forester or his designee.
- b) Logging debris is to be kept to a minimum. All logs and pulpwood are to be marked to length in the woods to eliminate short ends at the landings.
- c) Upon conclusion of use, the landings will be cleared of debris (including bark and rocks), graded smooth with positive drainage, and ditched as directed by the Regional Forester or his designee. Immediately after final grading, the contractor will apply seed and straw mulch to the landings in accordance with specifications outlined in Section 7 below.

## 6) SKIDDING

a) Skid trails will be designated by the Regional Forester or his designee. Existing trails are to be used for skidding and must be left open and level.

- b) Bulldozed skid trails will be required for blocks 4, 5, & 7. Trail locations will be coordinated with the forester in charge.
- c) Temporary skidding bridges may be required to cross a buried gas line in block 1. The location of the bridges will be identified by the Regional Forester or his designee during operations.
- d) Skidders are to be kept off haul roads as much as possible.
- e) Wet areas should be avoided when skidding and any treetops which are felled into wet areas should be left in the water rather than pulling them out.
- f) If skid trails are to sit idle for one month or more, they are to have water bars added.
- g) Main skid trails are to be leveled, open and have water bars added at the conclusion of the sale.

## 7) SEEDING OF ROADWAYS AND LANDINGS

a) At the conclusion of the sale, all landings and disturbed areas along gameland roads are to be leveled, cleared of rocks and debris and seeded according to the following:

6 lbs. per acre of White Dutch Clover - Inoculated Seed 10 lbs. per acre of Crimson Clover 25 lbs. per acre of Wheat or oats

- Inoculated Seed

Lime 4 tons per acre. Fertilizer - 300 lbs. per acre of 10-20-20

## Approximately 3 acres is to be seeded at the conclusion of the sale.

- b) Straw mulch will be required at a rate of 2.5 tons per acre or 100 bales per acre.
- c) Regional Forester is to be notified prior to the application of lime, seed, fertilizer, and mulch.
- d) All bulldozed skid trails are to be seeded with wheat.
- e) Guaranteed catch of cover must be obtained to the satisfaction of the Regional Forester before the bond will be released. Seeding done after September 30 will not be inspected until May 15 of the following year in order to assure winter survival.

## 8) OPERATIONS AND NON-WORK DAYS

- a) No woods operation will be permitted on the following days:
  - 1. All Saturdays in the months of September, October, November, December, and January.
  - 2. The opening day and all Saturdays during spring turkey season, including the youth spring gobbler hunt.
  - 3. The added Sunday of the statewide archery season in November
  - 4. All the days of the general statewide bear season
  - 5. The entire 2 weeks of the general firearms deer season
  - 6. The opening day of the flintlock muzzleloader season

No woods operation will be permitted from March 1 to May 15 without the permission of the officer-in-charge.

- b) The contractor, employees, and sub-contractors may not hunt to, from, or at the job site when the work location is beyond a gated road that is closed to public traffic. The contractor may travel to and from the work location on no-work days to check on the condition of equipment.
- c) Except on Sundays, it is unlawful to be present on State Game Lands from November 15 through December 15 inclusive when not engaged in lawful hunting or trapping and fail to wear a minimum of 250 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material on the head, chest, and back combined, or in lieu thereof, a hat of the same colored material. The material shall be worn so it is visible in a 360-degree arc.

## 10) MISCELLANEOUS

- a) Operator must comply with the erosion and sedimentation control plan for the area.
- b) Extra caution should be taken to avoid felling damage or skidding damage to reserved trees.
- All existing trails and at least one main skid trail must be kept open for hunter access in each block.
- d) Implement spill pollution prevention measures as follows: 1. Carry oil spill kits for hydraulic fluids, lubricating oils, fuels, and other environmentally hazardous fluids onsite when equipment is active. Spill kits must include pads and containment socks (rated to absorb 8+ gal. petroleum-based fluids and able to absorb fluids in water and on the ground), containers (or heavy-duty bags) capable of holding 8+ gal contaminated soil and other absorbents, and a shovel. 2. Contain leaks/spills immediately. 3. Properly dispose of Soil and absorbents through a landfill approved by the Department of Environmental Protection. 4. Take any precautions, as directed by PGC foresters, to prevent soil erosion, water pollution, and other conditions detrimental to the environment on State Game Lands. Follow all DEP guidelines and regulations relating to spills and spill prevention.
- e) To minimize the spread of invasive plants, all earth-moving and logging equipment (bulldozers, mechanical fellers, skidders, loaders, chippers, etc.) should be thoroughly cleaned prior to entering the State Game Lands (SGL).
- f) Violation of contract provisions by the operator may subject the operator or its employees or contractors to fine based on Title 58 regulations.
- g) Payment for Block 1 is due at contract execution.

## 12) PA RIGHT TO KNOW PROVISIONS

### CONTRACT PROVISIONS - RIGHT TO KNOW LAW

- a. The Pennsylvania Right-to-Know Law, 65 P.S. §§ 67.101-3104, applies to this contract.
- b. Unless the Contractor provides the Commonwealth, in writing, with the name and contact information of another person, the agency shall notify the Contractor using the Contractor information provided by the Contractor in SRM [or "the legal contact information provided in this contract"] if the agency needs the Contractor's assistance in any matter arising out of the Right to Know Law ("RTKL"). The Contractor shall notify the agency in writing of any change in the name or the contact information within a reasonable time prior to the change.
- c. Upon notification from the Commonwealth that the Commonwealth requires the Contractor's assistance in responding to a RTKL request for records in the Contractor's possession, the Contractor shall provide the Commonwealth, within fourteen (14) calendar days after receipt of such notification, access to, and copies of, any document or information in the Contractor's possession which arises out of the contract that the Commonwealth requests ("Requested Information") and provided such other assistance as the Commonwealth may request in order to comply with the RTKL. If the Contractor fails to provide the Requested Information within fourteen (14) calendar days after receipt of such request, the Contractor shall indemnify and hold the Commonwealth harmless for any damages, penalties, detriment or harm that the Commonwealth may incur as a result of the Contractor's failure, including any statutory damages assessed against the Commonwealth.
- d. The Commonwealth's determination as to whether the Requested Information is a public record is dispositive of the question as between the parties. Contractor agrees not to challenge the Commonwealth's decision to deem the Requested Information a Public Record. If the Contractor considers the Requested Information to include a request for a Trade Secret or Confidential Proprietary Information, as those terms are defined by the RTKL, the Contractor will immediately notify the Commonwealth, and will provide a written statement signed by a representative of the Contractor explaining why the requested material is exempt from public disclosure under the RTKL within seven (7) calendar days of receiving the request. If, upon review of the Contractor's written statement, the Commonwealth still decides to provide the Requested Information, Contractor will not challenge or in any way hold the Commonwealth liable for such a decision.
- e. The Commonwealth will reimburse the Contractor for any costs associated with complying with this provision only to the extent allowed under the fee schedule established by the Office of Open Records or as otherwise provided by the RTKL if the fee schedule is inapplicable.
- f. Contractor agrees to abide by any decision to release a record to the public made by the Office of Open Records, or by the Pennsylvania Courts. The Contractor agrees to waive all rights or remedies that may be available to it as a result of the Commonwealth's disclosure of Requested Information pursuant to the RTKL. Contractor's duties relating to the RTKL are continuing duties that survive the expiration of this contract and shall continue as long as the Contractor has Requested Information in it possession.



- 2. WIDEN AND GRADE ROADWAY SUBGRADE TO REQUIRED WIDTH WITH CENTER CROWN AS SHOWN. PROVIDE GRADE BREAKS AND BROAD BASED DIPS AS REQUIRED OR AS DIRECTED BY PGC STAFF TO ACCOMMODATE THE ROAD GRADE, TERRAIN, AND SITE CONDITIONS TO FACILITATE DRAINAGE ALONG AND ACROSS ROADWAY. COMPACT SUBGRADE WITH 10-TON (MIN.) VIBRATORY DRUM ROLLER.
- 3. PROVIDE STONE BASE USING BORROW MATERIAL EXCAVATED FROM PIT ON STATE GAME LANDS 12" MIN. COMPACTED DEPTH WITH CENTER CROWN AS SHOWN. COMPACT BASE WITH 10-TON (MIN.) VIBRATORY DRUM ROLLER.
- 4. PROVIDE DITCHES AND DITCH TURNOUTS AS SHOWN OR AS DIRECTED BY PGC STAFF TO COLLECT AND DIRECT STORMWATER RUNOFF AWAY FROM ROAD SURFACE.
